When I think of the tools that KCCK uses to carry out our mission, I think of our daily shows and the announcers who host them. I also think of programs that are off air but just as important — mainly

our education programs, such as Corridor Jazz, Jazz Band Camp, and Schoolhouse Jazz, and events like Jazz Under the Stars. In computer parlance, I focus on the "software" much more than the hardware (i.e., the devices and tech through which we deliver these things).

Until something breaks, of course.

This year I found myself thinking about our broadcast tower more than I have in quite some time. Early in the year some of our tower lights failed, notably the one at the very top of the 400-meter structure. Since we're located less than 2 miles from the Eastern lowa Airport, this has

the potential of being quite problematic. I soon learned that tower climbers are in somewhat short supply these days (kids – career opportunity, as long as you don't mind heights!).

It was several months before we were able to get a service person to check out the problem. He found that the top of the tower beacon had literally been torn off, probably during the derecho. Then, while attempting to replace the beacon, he discovered there was a short somewhere in more than 500 feet of wiring connecting the lights to power. It definitely felt like a one-step-forward-two-steps-back kind of experience.



This is an issue that involves more than just KCCK, as the tower is a significant Kirkwood asset, not to mention the tallest structure on campus. Fortunately, after examining options with the college, we decided to replace all the lights and wiring. The new lights will be LED, resulting in significant energy savings. We should have the new system in place by spring.

All in all, while we've had to worry about infrastructure more this year than in years past, I am thankful that broadcast equipment is still built to last. In an age where most devices and appliances obsolesce after what seems like a very short time (remember when refrigerators would last 20 or more years?), much of our equipment is still going strong after a decade or more.

Which makes me glad, because I really would rather concentrate on the "software."

STAFF PROFILE: Bob Stewart

Bob Stewart has been keeping you company on KCCK for more than two decades and has been named JazzWeek magazine's Programmer of the Year seven times! But how did he get interested in jazz and in broadcasting? To ferret out these juicy nuggets, we turned to someone who sees Bob every day: KCCK midday host Hollis Monroe.

HM: I know you're a performer as well as a producer and program director. Where did you receive your musical training?

Bob: I didn't really receive any formal musical training per se, but I loved to sing! I had several lessons along the way, but most of my learning has been on the job, as it were. I've been singing in choral ensembles from the time I was in elementary school and I've just absorbed all the valuable lessons and techniques imparted by some very talented and knowledgeable choral directors along the way. My formal training came in my chosen field of broadcasting, which I studied at the University of Iowa.

HM: How did you come to choose broadcasting as a field?

Bob: The campus station, KRUI, had been shut down for several years when, in my sophomore year, they cleared the dust away and brought it back to life. I started out doing a couple of shows, one being a jazz program, and eventually had the titles of music

director and program director. I then had the opportunity to take my jazz show to a local rock station, KKRQ in lowa City, and do a Sunday morning program while I was still in school. After graduation, they took me on full time. After a couple of years, I moved crosstown to another rock station, KRNA, a stint that lasted nearly 15 years. It was in 1999 that a former colleague from my college radio days, Dennis Green, became the general manager of KCCK and wondered if I might be interested in joining him. Finally, I was able to put my passions for jazz and radio together! It's been 22 years and counting in what has been a dream job.

HM: How did you discover jazz?

Bob: My first exposure to jazz that I remember was as a kid watching Sunday morning television when one of the stations ran "The Glenn Miller Story" starring Jimmy Stewart. It was the fascinating tale of Miller's quest for that certain sound that would set his big band apart from all the others. And that music definitely caught my ear. I began doing big band "radio shows" into a little cassette player, commercials and all, which I guess was my first, unofficial foray into broadcasting.

Later on, a family member turned me on to John Coltrane, which to this day is still my favorite of all. That led to explorations of Miles Davis, Thelonious Monk, and others. A high school chum introduced me to jazz fusion bands like Weather Report, Return to Forever, and Passport. I was pretty much open to any kind of jazz by then. Thanks to the Columbia Record Club, I discovered artists like Carla Bley, McCoy Tyner, and Erroll Garner. By my college days I was fully enamored by the music, spending countless hours in the local record stores seeking out more gems. And Hancher Auditorium's jazz series brought people like Pat Metheny, George Benson, The Crusaders, Jean-Luc Ponty, Dizzy Gillespie, Stan Getz, Dave Brubeck, and many other greats to campus ... I was in heaven!

HM: What would you say is the secret for success at KCCK?

Bob: The success of KCCK wouldn't be possible without all the people down through the years who have been passionate and dedicated to the music and the station. But we're also lucky to be situated in an area where the jazz scene is very vibrant. The Corridor has a wealth of talented performers and composers and arrangers who are deeply dedicated to the music. It's also important to note the work of all the educators — from the jazz programs at the University of Iowa, University of Northern Iowa, Coe College, and Kirkwood Community College, along with the directors of all the high school jazz programs in eastern Iowa — who instill in their students that passion for the music and produce the next generation of performers and composers and educators.

Looking back, it seems like a no-brainer that Killian Ritland would come to work at KCCK. After all, his dad played saxophone in college as a member of Johnson County Landmark, the University of Iowa's top jazz band. And his mom has been a Cedar Rapids-area radio personality ("Mo" on Z102.9) for many years. But when he came to KCCK's Jazz Band Camp as a rising sixth grader, no one could have predicted that career path. Especially Killian, who didn't particularly like jazz.

"Jazz was just what my dad listened to," Killian recalls. "And who wants to listen to the music their dad does?"

In another small act of rebellion, Killian took up the trombone rather than the instrument his dad played. This is even more notable because Killian was born with a cleft palette, which required many surgeries as a youngster as well as a lot of work on his speech. And yet he picked a brass instrument, perhaps the most difficult musical choice for someone with an unusual mouth structure.

"It's certainly made things a little more challenging," he admits. "But everyone has a different mouth to begin with. So, I just had to take my own path and figure it out from there. There are some surgeries I could have now to cover up the scar tissue and all that. But I'm like, nah. I want to be reminded of how far I've come against the odds of not being able to play at all."

Even though he didn't have much interest in jazz, Killian was keenly interested in pursuing and playing music, so his parents signed him up for Jazz Band Camp. It didn't take long for the lightbulb to go on. Anthony Williams, DMA, jazz band camp instructor and UNI trombone professor, said something in trombone sectionals that Killian took to heart.

"He said, 'You don't need to become a master or anything. You just learn to appreciate it. And listen.' And that's exactly what I did that day. I went home and just threw on 'Kind of Blue,' which is many people's introduction album to jazz. And I thought, 'I kinda like this actually.' And so I kept kind of diving more into it. I got into some Ellington, videos I found on YouTube, and it just kind of kept spiraling until I learned to like it. But I started out hating it and ended up loving it!"

Once the jazz bug bit Killian, there was no stopping him. As he prepared for high school at Liberty, he successfully auditioned for the top jazz band as a freshman. He would go on to become a two-time Jazz All-Stater.

He stayed involved with KCCK through high school, too, participating in the Corridor Jazz Project and eventually returning to Jazz Band Camp as a counselor. Killian sensed that KCCK would be the perfect place for someone like him, interested in both jazz and broadcasting. But how would he get his foot in the door?

"One adage my mom taught me very early was to just keep saying yes. When someone asks you to do something, say yes. Ask, 'How can I help?' That was how I came back to Jazz Band Camp as a counselor, which led to me being around when someone was needed to help with the lowa City Jazz Festival, then Jazz Under the Stars. I always said yes. One night Ron (Adkins) said, 'What would you think about being on the air?' And I was so excited, because that's always kind of been the dream. And now I have a show on Thursday nights!"

Killian balances his work at KCCK with classes at the University of Iowa where he is a Trombone Performance major; his activities include such groups as the Jazz Repertory Ensemble. Postgraduation plans? Perhaps performing on a cruise ship for a few years before returning to school for an advanced degree, or operating his own lessons studio. He says performing is his real passion, though, and that will always be a major focus of his career.

He's become a valuable member of the KCCK team, and we look forward to seeing what new things he says yes to in the future!





MEMBER PROFILE: Janice Showers

Janice Showers, Iowa expatriate now of Gainesville, Florida, may have retired to a much warmer college town, but she will always have deep ties to lowa, and a close connection to KCCK.

Janice is an all-day listener. "I turn (KCCK) on and let it play." Outside, she listens on her phone while she works on a current chore: reinforcing her fences to keep the armadillos out.

Yes, armadillos. Janice says keeping these "tactical possums" from digging up her yard is a near-constant task.

Living in the hometown of the University of Florida, Janice says she's required to ask, "Did the Gators play today? Did they win? Go Gators!" But in the next breath, she lets out a rousing, "Go Hawkeyes!"


