The band directors and guest artists have become my colleagues and friends over the 17 years of this program. Some have been involved nearly every year the program has been in existence! I also get a little thrill when I see a student name I remember from jazz band camp and marvel at how that young sixth grader, so timid and reluctant to take their first public solo, now leads their section.

There's another group of familiar names, too. These are students who participated in the Corridor Jazz Project in school and now are back as band directors and guest artists. More than a half-dozen directors and performers in the past two years are Corridor Jazz Project alums themselves. Each of them has told me that this program was fundamental to their high school experience, and they're proud to continue the tradition with this year's students.

Would these passionate educators and mentors be seeing the same success today without KCCK and Corridor Jazz? Certainly. But I'd like to think that their experience played a small role in setting their feet on the path to give the next generation of musicians the same firm grounding that they received.

And you don't have to be a musician for this program to have been a memorable part of your high school career. A technician at my veterinarian's office recently recognized me and talked fondly about her experience in jazz band and getting to make a professional recording.

That's what we're in the business of doing here at lowa's Jazz Station — not just playing good music on the radio, but also providing opportunities and growth experiences within music that will pay dividends in our community now and in the future.

In these pages you'll see pictures of tomorrow's band directors and professional musicians, as well as medical and business professionals, craftspeople, and community leaders. As someone who gets to see them in action, both while they're in school and in the years beyond, I can tell you that I think our future is in very good hands.

Murray Kent Celebrates 20 Years of Swing

For many KCCK listeners, Murray Kent and "Big Band Memories" is a weekend tradition. Murray's rich, deep, baritone voice has introduced the best in vintage jazz at KCCK for 20 years, and he has just begun sharing his collection with his audience.

When asked just how big a music library he owns, Murray replied with a grin, "The closest word would be 'extensive." Ironically, he added, his passion for music and record collecting began with an early love of classical music. "I got the bug listening to the symphony concerts at Sinclair Auditorium at Coe College with my dad."

Hearing Louis Armstrong in concert in 1966 kicked off his love of jazz. After the show, a smitten Murray went backstage to meet Satchmo but was stopped by the manager, saying that after two shows, Louis was too tired to meet fans. Undeterred, Murray stood outside the tour

bus in subzero weather until Louis came out. "He figured anyone stupid enough to stand out in that weather deserved a greeting," he said. Louis autographed a photo Murray had brought along and posed for one with the new jazz fan. Murray still cherishes that photo.

Murray did make it backstage to meet such jazz royalty as Ella Fitzgerald, Louis Bellson, Harry James, and Les Brown, however.

Murray's "extensive" jazz collection began when he joined a mail-order record club and chose the LP of Benny Goodman's Carnegie Hall concert. "I've accumulated a lot, but I always find more," Murray said.

KCCK listeners are fortunate to hear samplings from Murray's collection each Sunday from 1 to 5 p.m. He originally co-hosted "Big Band Memories" with Cary J. Hahn. Upon Cary's passing, Murray began hosting all four hours himself. In homage to Cary, Murray said he likes to play one of Cary's favorites, Glenn Miller, along with other great big band-era superstars, in the early portion of the show. Each week, Murray curates vintage and swing-era hits, plus many forgotten gems and early recordings.

"Big Band Memories" is actually Murray's second show on KCCK. He began at the station in 1976, hosting "Rendezvous With Rhythm" for a decade. It, too, was a popular show and led into "A Prairie Home Companion" when KCCK ran that program.

Murray's career in radio began at KWPC in Muscatine; he then spent time in commercial radio before a tour of duty with Armed Forces Radio overseas. "I was definitely not your Adrian Cronauer type with his kind of playlist," Murray joked. "I was on the FM side, so I got to play Benny Goodman and those guys, and all kinds of jazz."

KCCK, and Murray's many fans, are very happy with his choice of playlist, and his love of jazz. We hope he keeps us swinging for another 20 years.

Liz Schultz is Making Headlines

Kirkwood sophomore Liz Schultz took some big steps on her career path as KCCK's 2023 summer news intern.

She worked closely with KCCK News Director George Dorman to acquire necessary skills to excel in broadcast journalism. "George did a great job teaching me how to write a news piece," Liz said, adding that he also mentored her on what to include, and not include, in a good story.

While at KCCK, Liz learned the finer points of editing content and selecting good soundbites, and the technical aspects of uploading content to the website. She also gained field reporting experience by conducting interviews with members of the community, which she found extremely rewarding. "I met a lot of people and was exposed to many different experiences," which only betters her skill set as a journalist, she said.

"It's always nice to have young people around the station, and it's good to work with someone who wants to be part of the next generation of journalists," said George. "Liz has been an eager and quick learner. I usually only have to show her how to do something once and she catches on. I'm looking forward to seeing how her career advances."

Liz put her skills into practice by reading morning news breaks; she continues to sit in for George at least once a week. Two pieces she produced — reporting on Kirkwood President Lori Sundberg's retirement and the addition of electric school buses to the Cedar Rapids Community School District's fleet — were picked up and broadcast on lowa Public Radio.

"I'm very proud of Liz and how she excelled during her internship at KCCK this summer," said General Manager Dennis Green. "It's been a pleasure getting to know her, from her high school days to her time here at Kirkwood, and it's going to be fun watching as her career takes off."

In high school at Clear Creek-Amana, Liz was first exposed to KCCK through the Corridor Jazz Project. In addition to performing on the Corridor Jazz recording and concert, she volunteered to be a guest DJ on KCCK, representing her school. It was during her show that she talked with Dennis Green about an internship.

"I've always been interested in jazz," she said. "I've also learned about what KCCK does to guide students and offer them opportunities." Not just in music, she adds, but also, in her case, a chance to explore a future as a newsperson.

After graduating from Kirkwood, Liz will earn a degree in communications from the University of Iowa.

And then?

"News anchor," Liz said with certainty.

How Is Jazz Like an Orchid? Nile and Lois Know

Drs. Nile and Lois Dusdieker are big fans of KCCK ... and orchids.

"Orchids are kind of like jazz on KCCK," said Nile. "You can enjoy the beauty, learn the heritage, the background, even how it came into being."

Nile and Lois are longtime listeners and supporters of KCCK. "I can't remember when we weren't listening," said Nile. Their day begins with Bob Stewart's morning jazz and George Dorman's news, then "we have the radio on pretty much all day."

"We're so grateful for Nile's and Lois's continued support and friendship," said KCCK General Manager Dennis Green. "And it kind of embarrasses him when I say this, but when he comes to the studio fresh from the greenhouse, Nile is the best-smelling doctor I've ever met!"

In addition to their daily listening, Nile and Lois enjoy many of the live community events KCCK hosts. "We try to make as many Jazz Under the Stars as we can, and we've been to a dozen or more First Friday shows at the Opus. We really enjoy hearing the Corridor Jazz Project concerts when they're aired," said Nile.

"The people at KCCK should feel good about the work they do," he added. "It's important and it means something. Everyone today just wants to make money. That isn't the priority at KCCK. The music is, and the education."

Nile's love of jazz was cultivated during his time at the University of Iowa. "Count Basie and his Orchestra once played the Homecoming dance, and that's what got me hooked on big band," he said. While in med school, Nile led his own big band and dabbled in jazz piano.

Nile and Lois first met while studying at the university. Their love affair grew as they earned their degrees, then pursued careers in medicine. They will celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary in June 2024.

And, they continue to enjoy new adventures together — like a shared passion for orchids. "Lois got me into orchids," said Nile. "In 1986, I bought a Phalaenopsis (White Moth) orchid and named it Baby." Soon after, the greenhouse they'd installed for an edible garden was gradually transitioned to a haven for orchids of all varieties. They travel to a number of orchid shows every year and are very active in the Eastern lowa Orchid Society. Their love for this legendary flower fired their desire to learn all about them. (Did you know that 32 species of orchids are indigenous to lowa?)

"Part of their mystique is that they're thought to be an exotic, tropical plant that's hard to grow," said Nile, "but really, they're very hardy, and you can learn so much about them." For example, he said, "If you own a hybrid orchid, you can trace its lineage as one would trace their family tree."

Again, said Nile, much like jazz on KCCK, "You can listen for the pleasure, the beauty of the music, or you can listen to learn more about jazz." Either way, Nile believes, is delightful.


